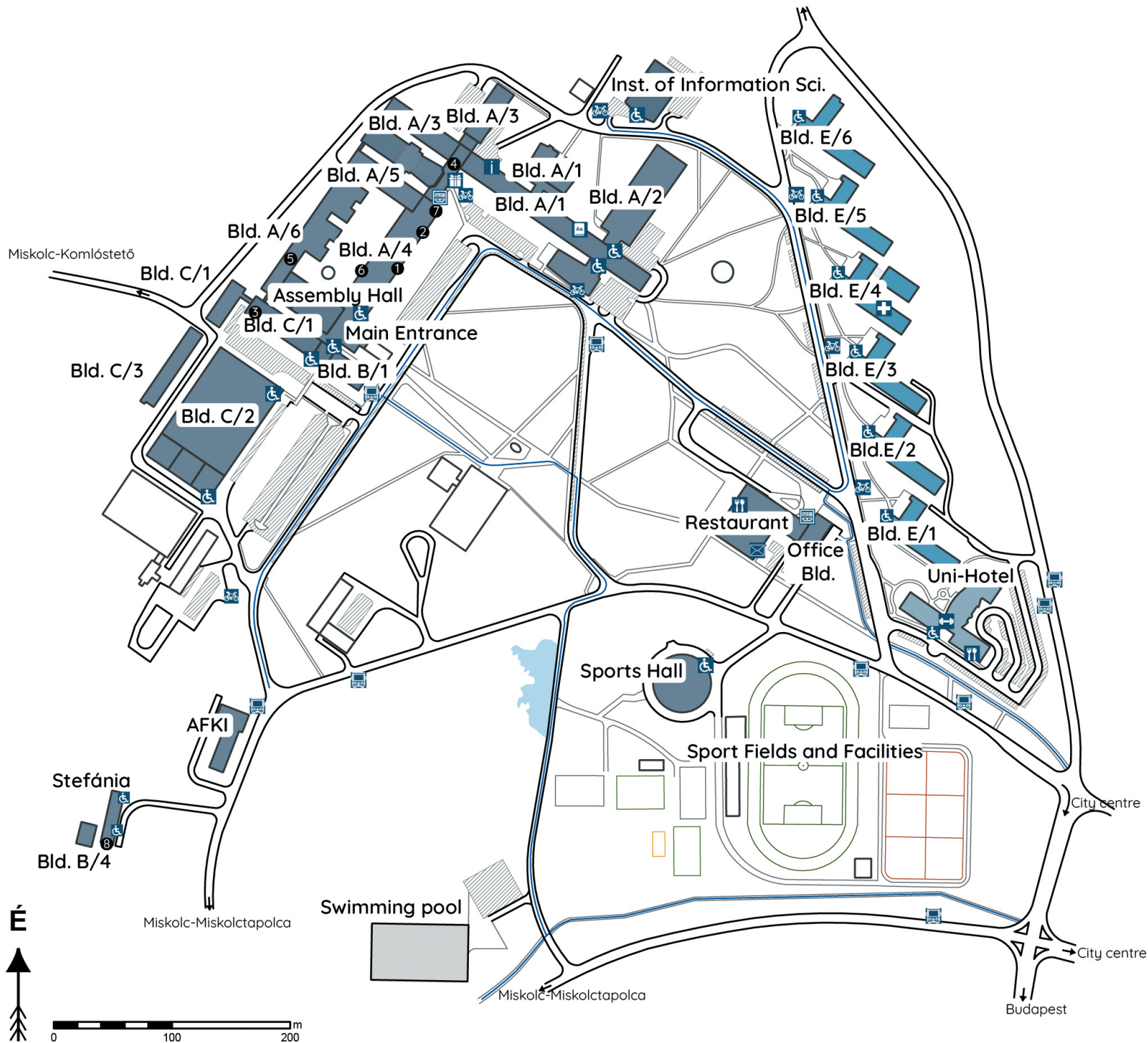

Letter of Acceptance / Final Letter of Admission

It is issued by the University of Miskolc and sent to you via e-mail or can be downloaded from the DreamApply platform. It confirms that you are accepted to study at the University of Miskolc as well as states that you are accommodated in one of the Student Hostels of the University of Miskolc if requested and pre-paid (on Campus). Should you not have this document, please let us know ASAP.



ADMINISTRATIVE TASKS

Let us call your attention to a few things before you leave for Hungary, to help you prepare for the great adventure of your life.

Your arrival in Hungary and Miskolc

Right after receiving your VISA, you should buy your flight ticket to Hungary. The sooner the better, as the price of tickets is increasing as September is approaching and also because you are expected to arrive in Miskolc at the beginning of September for the Freshmen's Camp. To make it a smooth arrival, do not forget to give feedback to the International Office as requested in the Information Letter about your arrival details.

Mentor systems

- Erasmus Student Network (ESN) – for incoming exchange students
- SHSN Mentor Network - for incoming degree students



Mentors are volunteer Hungarian and international students of the University, who provide academic, social and cultural support to international students throughout the academic year. They guide you on your way to the campus, help you in arranging your administrative duties and settling you in the dormitory.

ORIENTATION DAY

10 SEPTEMBER 2024

This official welcome event is designed for all first-year students and exchange students, just after the Freshmen's Camp. It provides you with information regarding your academic registration, study system, the administrative procedures and duties, the faculties, the student organizations, sport teams, laboratories and workshops which all help the freshmen to find their way around and settle in easily. The mentor team will guide you to the Orientation Day. Details are coming soon at the International Students of the University of Miskolc Facebook, via e-mail and at the website.



Registration (IRO, Dean's Office)

During the Orientation Day (10 September 2024) you will get to know the details of academic and administrative registration.

- Your academic registration – enrolment – takes place in the Dean's Office of your Faculty. (It does not refer to exchange students.)
- Your administrative registration takes place at IRO.

When registration you must submit the below documents either to the Dean's Office or to IRO. Without the below listed original documents, you will not be able to start your studies.

For state scholarship holder degree students: if you submitted a confirmation issued by the Ministry to your application instead of your degree, do not forget that **you must present the original document in 6 months time.**



Residence permit

After arrival, we will contact you about your residence permit if it is ready to be issued. Then, you have to reserve an appointment for yourself at the International Relations Office. There, you can collect your previously requested residence permit. EEA citizens can submit their application for a registration certificate in person at the customer service of the regional directorate responsible for their place of residence in Hungary, or electronically after registering on the electronic platform of the immigration policing (Enter Hungary).



Health insurance

It is highly recommended to all international students to take out a travel and health insurance in your home country for your travel and for a few weeks more just to stay on the safe side.

If you are an exchange student from EU, you can use your European Health Insurance Card for emergency medical care free of charge which you took out before departure in your home country.

If you are an exchange student from a non-EU country, you must have a valid insurance from your home country. It means that you will have to pay for the medical treatment in Hungary but later, when you return, based on the invoice you get at the hospital/GP your insurance company in your home country will refund your costs. It is also possible to take out a private health insurance in Hungary. Please contact the International Office if you need one.

If you are a state scholarship holder degree student you are entitled for the services of the Hungarian health care system and the services of a private insurance company free of charge. International Office colleagues will arrange both types of insurance for you.

If you are a self-financing degree student you must take out a private medical insurance on your own expense for your entire stay in Hungary. International Office colleagues are ready to help you with that during your academic registration.

Please note that it is compulsory for everyone to hold a valid medical insurance and it is a pre-condition of maintaining your student status.



Student card

Temporary student card

If you are an exchange student, following your registration at the International Office you will **automatically receive a temporary student card** issued by the Directorate for Educational Affairs (in the form of a document) free of charge, which is valid for 60 days. Renew it before expiry. If you are a degree student, first you have to apply for the **permanent student card** to get your temporary one.

Permanent student card

Mentor students will help in the application: they will make an appointment for you and take you to the Governmental Office outside the campus. Once the application is submitted, you receive a code which must be entered to Neptun. Once it is done, you get your temporary student card issued by the Directorate for Educational Affairs. The plastic, permanent student card will be ready in a few weeks.

Bank account

Only for degree students

During the first weeks of your stay in Hungary you must open a Hungarian bank account. Mentor students will assist you to do so. Why do you need a Hungarian bank account? If you are a scholarship holder, your monthly stipend will be transferred to this account. Besides, all students can transfer money easily from this account to the NEPTUN account. The cost of having a Hungarian account is app. 2 EUR/month. **Do not forget to e-mail your bank account number to the International Office (and the name of the bank) once you have it.**

Tax ID number

Only for degree students

All scholarship holder degree students need a Hungarian Tax ID number. For self-financing students it is not compulsory. No tax shall be paid on your stipend in Hungary but by law the university cannot transfer your stipend to your bank account unless you have a tax ID number. To receive the Tax ID card, you will be accompanied by your mentor to the Tax Office (NAV). You also need a tax ID in case you want to take up a job. **As you get your tax ID via post, please send the ID number to the International Office.**





Neptun (Dean's Office)

Only for degree students

The University of Miskolc uses the NEPTUN electronic administration system to manage all administrative and academic issues related to students' registration, courses, exams and stipends. The system is used by all students as well as administrators and lecturers throughout the university. With Neptun, you can

- access information about courses, study requirements, exam dates and locations;
- sign up for courses and exams;
- check grades;
- send and receive messages to and from lecturers and administrators;
- pay fees (retake exam fee, tuition fee, etc.).

The Dean's Office during your enrolment will register you in Neptun and will help you select your courses for the first semester.

In the following semesters it must be done on your own. (Exchange students have no tasks with Neptun.)



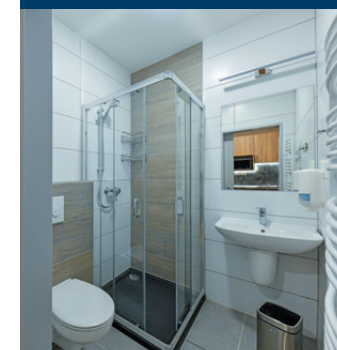
Accommodation

Accommodation is reserved for all international students in one of the student hostels located in the Campus if requested. However, **confirming your accommodation is needed** (to the International Office and mentors) up till the deadline (10 August 2024) is compulsory. If no confirmation arrives, **your reservation is cancelled**. Mentor students accompany you to your hostel and help you in checking in and signing the accommodation contract. As a general rule the contract is valid from the date you sign it till 30 June 2025. Please note that no payment is needed on arrival. For state-scholarship degree students the accommodation is included in their scholarship. The hostel has a multicultural community with various habits and lifestyles, so tolerance is a key factor for the residing students. The different hostels have double and triple bedded rooms and apartments. Basic equipment is available with laundry service and weekly cleaning service. The hostel coordinator of ISAN, **Ahmad Saifo (isan@uni-miskolc.hu)**, the mentors and the current students (<https://www.facebook.com/groups/640753418114997>) can help you with your questions and good-to-knows regarding the hostel.

HEALTH CARE



In Hostel E/4 located at the Campus the University maintains a GP and a Dentist Office which operate during weekdays during daytime. Prior appointment and **Hungarian mentor company is needed!**

In case of an urgent health problem (danger to life, accident, bleeding etc.),

1. call the ambulance – TELEPHONE: 112 – the call is free of charge (you may need a Hungarian speaking person to translate), but if you call the ambulance without any serious reason, you have to pay for it after.
2. go to the Emergency Department of the Central Hospital – appointment is not needed; address: Miskolc, Szentpéteri kapu 72-76.

If the problem is not an emergency

1. visit the GP or the Dentist in hostel E/4.* Make sure that you have an **appointment** for the doctors and that a **mentor student** accompanies you. Please note that different insurances provide you with different discounts, from free treatments to full-price treatments.
2. and you are a state scholarship holder degree student call the number given by the Hungarian private health insurance company (UNION insurance Co.) and you will get an appointment to a specialist.
3. If you are a freshman student, ask for help from your own mentor or the mentor coordinator before taking an appointment to the doctor. Senior students have no mentor, in this case, please, ask for help from the mentor coordinator.

Outpatient Consultation

At the University of Miskolc, outpatient consultations operate with the support of the Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén County Hospital and Teaching Hospital. Location is E/2 dormitory, ground floor.

There is an availability to request an appointment for:

- laboratory blood and sample collection
- gynecology consultation
- neurology consultation
- physiotherapy consultation
- ophthalmology consultation

An appointment is **required** for all patients. The international students need to **ask for help from their own mentors or the mentor coordinator**. Please note that it is necessary to request an appointment **at least two weeks before the order!**

*** The hostel E/4 is under renovation, so it is closed temporarily. We will inform you about the location of the doctors' office later.**

Miskolc

Miskolc is the 4th largest city in Hungary, with a population of around 200,000. Miskolc is the economic, educational and scientific centre of Northern Hungary, and the seat of Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén County.

Miskolc has a leading role in the field of culture, as well. From a cultural aspect the National Theatre of Miskolc, operating several types of stages, is a significant institution, being the oldest stone-built theater in the territory of present-day Hungary. It is where the first Hungarian-language performance was put on. The nationally famous Symphonic Orchestra of Miskolc plays an important role in the music life of the city. Its concert hall, the House of Arts, is the site of orchestral concerts, pop concerts and theater performances. The Cultural Center of Miskolc organizes several popular leisure programmes and festivals for all ages and interests throughout the year.

Miskolc is situated at the foot of the Bükk Hill's an ideal place for sport activities such as hiking, mountain biking, cross country running and rock climbing. The most popular sports of the town are soccer and ice hockey with huge fun-clubs and full-house sport events

- Cave bath in Miskolc-Tapolca, a unique creation in a natural cavern (10 minutes from the Campus)
- Ávas hill with small wine cellars (20 minutes from the Campus)
- Diósgyőr Castle (10 kilometres away from the Campus)
- Lillafüred holiday resort (20 kilometres from the Campus)
- Tokaj wine region (50 kilometres from the Campus)
- Eger wine region (50 kilometres from the Campus)

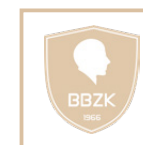

History in a nutshell

The legal predecessor of the University of Miskolc was the school of mining and metallurgy established in 1735 in Selmecbánya. It was the world's first higher education institution in these fields. The institution moved its location first to Sopron in 1920 then in 1949 to Miskolc. This was the time when it was re-established as the University of Heavy Industry. In the forthcoming years the technical faculties (the current Faculties of Earth Science and Engineering, of Materials Science and Engineering and of Mechanical Engineering and Informatics) were expanded with other faculties offering programmes in social sciences. Law courses started in 1981, the Faculty of Law was established in 1983, then it was followed by the Faculty of Economics in 1990 – the same year when the name of the university was changed to Miskolci Egyetem (University of Miskolc). In 1997 the Institute of Arts became a faculty, while the Miskolc department of Liszt Ferenc College of Music was integrated into the university as its Bartók Béla Institute of Music. The first bachelor programme of the Institute of Healthcare Studies was launched in 2001 and the institute received a faculty status in 2005 as an institute. In 2021 the Faculty of Health Sciences and the Bartók Béla Faculty of Music became faculties.



Tradition and modernity

The University is not just a traditional higher education institution, but also plays the role of an important scientific/research and cultural center of the North Hungarian region. It has its own extensive (85 hectares) and attractive campus with on-campus student housing and excellent sports and recreational facilities, including high-standard athletic fields, soccer grounds, and a great number of tennis courts. All the lecture and laboratory rooms are equipped to high standards and the spacious workshops include sophisticated technical facilities allowing also pilot-scale experimentation. High-speed computer network and broadband wifi access are available all throughout the university buildings, including a large scale central library equipped with abundant computer terminals. The calm and dominantly green campus includes all facilities required for not only the studies but also for the everyday life of students.



Internationalization

Apart from the large number of bachelor, master and doctoral programmes offered in Hungarian language, the University offers altogether 29 undergraduate, graduate and doctoral programmes in English in the fields of technical and social sciences, law, music and humanities. The programmes are based on strong theoretical foundations but also focus on the practical aspects of the given field. The aim is to develop the competences and knowledge expected not only by the generation Z, but also by all studying for a degree, to meet the expectations of the 21st century. The international student community of the university represents more than 70 countries and counts more than 450 students in 2024. The University welcomes all motivated, talented and open-minded students and provides them with not only with cutting edge knowledge and competences but also vivid student life, versatile social and academic programmes, on-campus accommodation, mentor system and many more. The International Alumni and Student Network and the Student Ambassador System provide international students with opportunities and platforms to represent their interest, to organize international events and to shape their life in the campus as well as their future career. The University is listed in QS and Times Higher Education rankings and actively contributes to the development of the European Higher Education Area via implementing numerous international educational and research projects in the Horizon Europe, EIT Raw Materials, Erasmus+, Ceepus, etc. programmes.



Directorate for Scientific Affairs and International Relations

International Office is responsible for managing international students at institutional level – it welcomes, settles and takes care of the administrative documents and processes of students. Colleagues of the International Office are in continuous contact with international students via e-mail and the Facebook page of ISAN.
